SPEAKER INFORMATION

Jamie Novak

James (Jamie) Novak is a Certified Fire Investigator (CFI), Certified Vehicle Fire Investigator (CVFI), licensed private investigator, and owner/operator of Novak Investigations, Inc. He began his career as a volunteer fire fighter with the City of Golden Valley in 1978 and soon became a part-time fire inspector/fire investigator for the department. In 1984, Jamie was hired as a Deputy State Fire Marshal with the Minnesota State Fire Marshal's office and in 1992, along with his investigative duties, took on the added responsibility as training coordinator for the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA) where he was responsible for teaching the basic, intermediate, and on-scene fire investigation series. In 1996, Jamie was hired by the St. Paul Fire Department and currently holds the position of fire investigator. During his 28+ years in the fire service, Jamie has conducted more than 2000 origin and cause investigations involving both fires and/or explosions. He has instrumented more than 1000 live burns and 18 explosions in his everlasting quest to uncover and discover the science involved in fire and explosion investigations. Jamie has traveled extensively throughout the United States and to such places as South Africa, Australia, Sweden, and the United Kingdom, to name a few, conducting training exercises and sharing his knowledge in the classroom and in the field in the areas of fire/explosion investigations and techniques. In 1994, he was a principal player in the development of the MN IAAI's Gas Migration and Explosion video.

Jamie has testified in court at both the State and Federal level on many occasions and has provided consultation services to a number of attorneys throughout the years.

Jamie held the position of president for the Minnesota Chapter of the International Association of Arson Investigators (MN IAAI) for 12 years and also served on the Board of Directors for the International Association of Arson Investigators from 1997 to 1999. He currently serves as Chairperson of the Testing and Research/Burn-to-Learn Committee, Co-Chair for the HazMat OSHA Committee, and is on the Training Committee for the MN Chapter of the IAAI.

Jamie's work has been cited in such publications as Crime Reconstruction by William Jerry Chisum and Brent E. Turvey, Scientific Protocols for Fire Investigation by John J. Lentini, and Kirk's Fire Investigation by John D. DeHaan.

Grand Forks Regional Bomb Squad

The Grand Forks Regional Bomb Squad is an FBI certified bomb Squad made up of officers from the Grand Forks Police Department, Grand Forks County Sheriff's Department and the University of North Dakota Police Department. The Bomb Squad is comprised of six FBI certified Hazardous Devices Technicians.

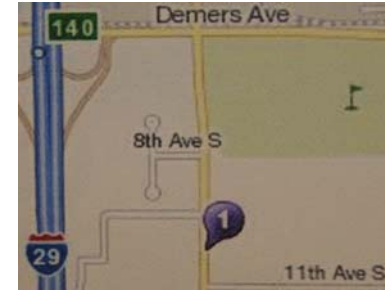
Each member of the Bomb Squad has attended the 6-week FBI Hazardous Devices School in Huntsville, Alabama. The bomb squad is nationally certified and is overseen by the FBI. Each member is also deputized by the US Marshals in the event we are called out of state where our normal jurisdiction would end.

The Grand Forks Regional Bomb Squad responds to calls in eleven counties that make up the North East response region and to any request for assistance in western Minnesota.

The squad's monthly training early in 2009 was centered on the training of two apprentice squad members waiting to attend the six week basic Hazardous Devices School. With the completion and graduation of the two members from HDS in late 2009 the Grand Forks Regional Bomb Squad is now fully staffed in accordance with national standards.

The high level of training and the strict federal requirements have led to more than 160 hours of training per squad member in 2009.
